

Icahn Stadium Attendees Policy

- **Food and Beverage**

- The following are prohibited inside the stadium
 - Outside food or beverage
 - Thermos
 - Non-plastic water bottles
- Empty, clear, water bottles are permitted

- **Bag Policy**

- The following bags are permitted
 - Large bags must be clear and cannot exceed 4.5' in height and 3.4' in width
 - Small bags must be the size of a small clutch or purse
 - Diaper bags and medical bags are allowed without size restrictions (bags will be checked by security upon entering)
- The following bags are prohibited
 - Large purses
 - Backpacks
 - Tote bag
 - Seat cushion (must be less than 1" thick)
 - Fanny pack
 - Camera Case (except for Credentialed Media and Press)
 - Coolers
 - Briefcases
 - Suitcases
 - Computer bags

- **NOTE: For this year's USATF Outdoor & Para National Championships, attendees can bring the clear shopping bag from the USATF vendors into the stadium (pictured below). Additionally, USATF will be selling a branded backpack that can also come into the stadium ONLY if put within said clear shopping bag.**



- **Animals**
 - Service animals and service animals in training are permitted. All other animals are prohibited.
- **Miscellaneous Items**



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- Bikes, Skateboards, Roller Blades, Scooters
- Smoking of any of the items vapes, cigarettes, Marijuana
- Drones and Kites
- Tents and Canopies
- Flyers
- Beach Umbrellas or Beach Chairs
- Signs and Banners
- Noisemakers, plastic horns, air horns, whistles, Laser pointers
- Weapons of any kind
- Streamers, Confetti, Balloons



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- **Code of Conduct**

Icahn Stadium is committed to creating a safe, comfortable, and enjoyable gameday experience for all fans and players. The following conduct is prohibited in Icahn Stadium and all parking lots, and surrounding areas of Icahn Stadium.

- Behavior that is unruly, disruptive, threatening, or violent in nature includes verbal or physical harassment of match officials, players, staff, or fans.
- Conduct that is illegal
- Conduct which results in damage to the venue or other private property.
- Displaying signs, symbols, images, using language or making gestures that are threatening.
- Entering or attempting to enter the field, the track, or offices of the stadium.
- Throwing objects of any kind
- Failing to follow requests from venue staff regarding stadium operations, policies, and emergency procedures.
